Meeting Room Upgrade

Tracy Library's Public Meeting Room recently received an upgrade. A new projector, audio/visual service, whiteboard and tables have enhanced the meeting rooms capabilities for meetings and presentations. Contributions from the Friends of the Library helped fund the upgrades.

Tracy's meeting room is available to local organizations engaging in educational, cultural or civic activities and events. The new audio visual equipment makes the meeting room a great venue for group presentations. To secure the meeting room for a meeting or event, a one- page application for can be submitted to the circulation desk.


Morning Book Group

The Morning Book Discussion Group meets once a month at the Tracy Library. The program is a joint effort by the Library and the Council on Aging (COA) and is open to all adults. Assistant Librarian Justin Levesque facilitates the discussion. The group meets on the second Tuesday each month and the reading rotates between fiction and non-fiction. Introducing Justin Levesque

Justin Levesque became Tracy Library's Assistant Librarian in October of last year.

A Concord native, Justin started his library career at the Abbott Library, working up from a library aid to Assistant Librarian in 2018. In a change of pace, Justin took a position at Dartmouth Baker-Berry library in 2022. However, an academic library didn't fit with his hands-on approach to serving patrons. "I missed the community library environment." His biggest challenge at Tracy is getting to know the facilities and resources of the library. Since joining Tracy Library, Justin has taken on several duties facilitating the Morning Book Discussion Group, ordering books, handling patron requests, and promoting the library's digital resources at the Open House in February. His goals for this year include developing an adult summer reading program, and reviving author talks with local writers. Justin's own reading interests run a wide range with science fiction and short stories as favorites. Among authors he reads are J.K. Jemisin, George Saunders and Raymond Carver.


